### **MSJ Student Run Pro Bono PT Clinic**

Thank you to all of the patients, volunteer PTs, and students who participated in the 2023-2024 MSJ Student Run Pro Bono PT Clinic! Run by our own students, the clinic offers free services to anyone who needs physical therapy, regardless of their insurance coverage, or lack thereof or ability to afford co-pays.

Over the past 2 years we've provided over \$54,000 worth of PT services during 436 visits to community members between the ages of 13 and 89 years old. These individuals had various problems with their joints (shoulder, neck back, hip) and were recovering from and living with neurologic conditions such as stroke, spinal cord injuries and multiple sclerosis. Still other patients wanted help with their balance and to improve their strength to allow them to stay active and at home.

Please consider volunteering or referring patients! The Fall 2024 clinic runs from **September 17, 2024 to November 23, 2024** (Tuesdays evenings, 6-8:00pm and Saturday mornings, 9-11:00am). Please call or email if you are interested in being a volunteer PT overseeing the care provided by the students, OR refer a patient who has exhausted their insurance benefits or who could benefit from additional therapy.

## Alumni Spotlight

Dr. Sara Young, PT, DPT, DHS, Assistant Professor (Class of 2023)



Sara began working for Miami Valley Hospital (MVH) in Dayton, OH in January 2004. She was a PT on the inpatient rehabilitation unit and eventually transitioned into a brain injury specialist. Sara also served on a rotation of wheelchair clinics and took over the clinic in 2008, which she continues to run to this day. Sara returned to MSJ in 2006 and earned her transitional Doctor of PT degree in 2008.

In 2015, Sara took on the role of Site Coordinator of Clinical Education for MVH acute care, rehab, and outpatient PT and PTAs. In 2017, Sara began teaching as an adjunct instructor for a local PTA program. After the first day in the classroom Sara said, "I love this, the students listen and want to learn what I have to teach them." This was compared to the preschool and school-age sports and church classes she had previously taught. With this experience, Sara realized she wanted to eventually teach full-time and began working on her Doctor of Health Science in 2019. Sara just recently defended her dissertation on the knowledge of age-related changes in older adults and graduated with her DHS in May 2024.



Sara and her husband Jim (18 years) have 4 children. They enjoy camping, hiking, going on adventures, and attending various sporting events for each of the kids. Sara enjoys coaching swimming, diving, and soccer for her kids.

In January 2020, Sara became Program Director and Assistant Professor for Edison State's Physical Therapy Assistant (PTA) Program.

Sara enjoys teaching and loves seeing students grow into clinicians. Sara views teaching as a coach to guide her students along their learning journey. Her instructors at MSJ inspired Sara to connect with students and make learning fun. She often takes on the role of a patient to make classroom learning more life-like to prepare her students for patient care.
