Ohio licensed educators who hold a prekindergarten certificate, special certificate for education of the handicapped, primary or intervention specialist license can earn this fully online endorsement to teach students ages 3-5 with special needs.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Potential students must meet the following requirements:

- A completed online application at www.msj.edu/apply.
- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution.
- A copy of current Ohio teaching license.
- A letter of intent including reasons for applying to the program and professional goals.
- A current resumé.
- Official college transcripts sent to Graduate Admission showing a cumulative GPA of no less than 3.0; a GPA below 3.0 requires completion of the GRE.
- Names and contact information for two professional references.
