## **Admission Criteria**

- A BSN degree or an entry-level generalist master's degree in nursing (such as the Mount's MSN-MAGELIN degree) from a regionally accredited university
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- A grade of "C" or higher in an undergraduate statistics course
- One year of professional work experience as a nurse

## Admission Criteria

A Master of Science in Nursing degree (post-licensure) from a regionally accredited college or university

(a) Or, other applicants with a BSN and a master's degree from a regionally accredited college or university in a related field

(b) Or, a pre-licensure MSN graduate with a post-master's Advanced Practice Nursing certification (CNM, CNS, CRNA, and CNP)

- A minimum graduate GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for MSN
- A "C" or higher in an undergraduate or graduate statistics course
- One year of professional work experience as a nurse
- An active US state RN license with no restrictions.

## NURSE FACULTY LOAN PROGRAM (NFLP)

- Annual awarded grant created to increase the number of qualified nursing faculty
- The maximum amount of funding per student is up to \$40,000/year
- After graduation, up to 85% of the total NFLP loan is forgiven over a consecutive four-year period, while loan recipients work in a nursing faculty role in a full-time capacity
- HRSA has expanded the definition of a full-time faculty to include the following:

- A one- to two-page essay with reasons for seeking the DNP including a statement of professional goals, and topic(s) of interest for DNP project.
- A professional resumé.
- Names and contact information of two professional references.
- A TOEFL score for international students (as needed).
- Admission fee is \$50. Will be waived if the application is completed by July 15, 2023 (Code-TBD).
