Students who major in Management will be able to apply knowledge of leadership and management to increase efficiency and effectiveness in accomplishing organizational goals. Students gain a strong, ethical foundation and an awareness of global and social issues in business. They are encouraged to participate in co-ops/internships. Graduates use their knowledge to contribute to business operations, logistics, and supply chain management in organizations ranging from large corporations to small businesses. Management majors may enroll in the 4+1 MBA program during their senior year. This option enables students to graduate with two degrees in five years: a Bachelor of Science in Management degree and a Master of Business Administration.
