### **IN-DEMAND CAREER POTENTIAL**

Demand for speech-language pathologists is predicted to grow 29% through 2030 (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021), making the employment outlook very strong. Employment for audiologists is expected to grow 16% as the population ages and their hearing is affected (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2021).
