# Our Freedom Dreams: Race, Gender, Sexuality and the Mount's Mission

Featuring: Dr. Craig Ford Jr., Assistant Professor of Theology and Religious Studies



Craig A. Ford, Jr., is an Assistant Professor of Theology and Religious Studies at Saint Norbert College, where he teaches courses in Christian Ethics; Ecclesiology; and Race, Gender and Sexuality while also serving as Co-Director for the Peace and Justice Interdisciplinary Minor. He is also a faculty member at the Institute for Black Catholic Studies—hosted at Xavier University of Louisiana, the nation's only Catholic HBCU— where he teaches courses on Black

Theology as well as on Topics in Moral Theology from a Black Perspective. A graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Yale Divinity School, and Boston College, Dr. Ford writes on topics at the intersection of queer theory, critical race theory, and the Catholic moral tradition. His most recent book project is titled *All of Us: The Future of Catholic Theology* From the Perspectives of Queer Theologians of Color. Considering himself a scholaractivist, Dr. Ford's work bridges the academy and a wider popular audience with publications in both professional and popular outlets. Dr. Ford is also sought out as a workshop leader on issues of racial, sexual, and gender justice, working not only with Catholic parishes but with other colleges, universities, and professional bodies, including most notably with the Association of Catholic College and Universities (ACCU) as its 2022 inaugural speaker for its Consortium for Senior Diversity Officers in Catholic Higher Education. Beyond the numerous awards received at St. Norbert College, Dr. Ford has also been recognized by the Green Bay Chamber of Commerce, receiving its "Future 15" Award in 2022, which recognizes the region's most promising young professionals. Most recently, Dr. Ford received the 2022 Catherine Mowry LaCugna Award, which recognizes the author of the best essay in theology by a younger member of the Catholic Theological Society of America, the largest body of theologians in the world.

#### **Adjunct Faculty Excellence in Teaching Award**

This award honors an outstanding colleague who demonstrates exceptional teaching as an adjunct faculty member. Candidates are nominated by the department chairs.

#### Pamela Kastner, Ed. D., Education

Pam is an educational consultant at the Pennsylvania Training and Technical Assistance Network (PaTTAN) Harrisburg, where she seves as the State Lead for Literacy in Pennsylvania. Dr. Kastner, along with the PaTTAN Literacy team, leads state-wide literacy initiatives which include professional learning in the science of reading and structured literacy; onsite training, coaching and consultation; a virtual literacy resource hub; and an international literacy conference. Dr. Kastner, along with the PaTTAN Literacy team, has lead Pennsylvania's Dyslexia Screening and Early Literacy Intervention Pilot Program, extension and expansion. She serves on the Pennsylvania Taskforce for Higher Education whose goal is to embed the science of reading and structured literacy in higher education institutions. Dr. Kastner is honored to serve as Adjunct Professor at Mount Saint Joseph University in the Reading Science Program where she teaches I nthe Masters and Doctoral Program. Dr. Kastner has the honor of serving as the President of The Reading League Pennsylvania, The Reading League Journal's Practitioner Editorial Board, and is a member of The Science of Reading: A Defining Movement Coalition.

#### Sister Adele Clifford, S.C. Award

This is the most prestigious teaching honor presented to a full-time member of the faculty. It is named in honor of the late Sister Adele Clifford, a Sister of Charity and long-time professor of biology as well as a former president of the Mount. Student nominations play a significant role in selecting the recipient.

#### Dr. Megan Dinnesen, Ed.D., Assistant Professor, Graduate Education

Dr. Megan Schneider Dinnesen joined the faculty at Mount St. Joseph University in 2020. Dr. Dinnesen earned her bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees at the University of Cincinnati. She is a proud FirstGen college graduate. Prior to coming to the Mount, Dr. Dinnesen worked as an intervention specialist in Ohio's public schools where she was recognized as a Master Teacher. Dr. Dinnesen worked with students with exceptionalities in grades K-5 and developed a passion for supporting self-advocacy and parent advocacy in special education. Dr. Dinnesen worked as a research project director at the University of Cincinnati, where she led research teams investigating the development of early literacy skills in young children with exceptionalities. Dr. Dinnesen also taught as an adjunct at UC. Her love for working with preservice teachers led her to pursue a position at MSJ, where she has found her professional home. She believes teachers can change the world and is grateful to work with colleagues who share this vision. #### **Emerging Scholar Award**

#### Dr. Michaelann Kelley, Ed. D., Assistant Professor, Art and Design

Dr. Michaelann Kelley, Ed.D., is the Chair and Assistant Professor of Art and Design at Mount St. Joseph University in Cincinnati, Ohio. Prior to this position, she was Director of Visual Arts for Aldine ISD in Houston, Texas. Dr. Kelley had been working at the district level for the past five years on the development of visual art curriculum and instruction. Prior to moving into administration, she was a high school art

teacher for 23 years at Eisenhower High School in Aldine ISD.

Dr. Kelley earned her B.A. and M.A. in visual arts and education from The College of Mt. St. Joseph (now Mount St. Joseph University) where she was awarded the Outstanding Alumna Award in 1995. She was named the Eisenhower High School Teacher of the Year in 1999 at Eisenhower High School and received the Stanford University Outstanding Teaching Award in 2013. Other recognitions include the 2018 Outstanding Art Educator Award in Administration and Supervision from the Texas Art Education Association, the 2020 National Art Education Association Western Region Supervision & Administration Art Educator Award and the 2021 Texas Art Education Association Distinguished Fellows Honor. Dr. Kelley is a regular presenter at Texas Art Education Association (TAEA), Ohio Art Education Association (OAEA), and the American Educational Research Association (AERA) conferences. Her numerous publications include journal articles, book chapters, and a 2020 book about her long-term collaboration in local school reform work.

#### **Distinguished Scholar Award**

This award, presented to an Associate or full Professor, recognizes the skill and contributory aspect of his or her career as a distinguished scholar who has been nationally and/or internationally recognized for scholarly achievement.

#### Kurt Grannan, M.F.A., Associate Professor, Art and Design

Patrick Cafferty is an Associate Professor and Founding Chair of the Department of Physician Assistant Studies in the School of Health Sciences. Before being recruited to the Mount in 2015, he had received his MPAS in Neurosurgery, from the University of Nebraska, and completed a postgraduate residency in surgery at the Norwalk Hospital/Yale University School of Medicine. Professor Cafferty has been a practicing PA and educator for the past 35 years. He has been actively involved with both state and national PA organizations, as well as representing the PA community to the American Medical Association's CPT Editorial Panel since 1994.

#### Michael Sontag, Ph.D., Dean of Arts and Humanities

Dr. Sontag is an associate professor of philosophy and dean of the School of Arts and Humanities. He teaches courses in the history of philosophy, ethics, philosophy of art, and philosophy of mind.

Dr. Sontag holds a Ph.D. from the University of Cincinnati (2006), which awarded him the Graduate School's 2001 Excellence in Teaching Award. Professor Sontag's research interests are in the areas of philosophy of mind and philosophical psychology, with a focus on theories of emotion.

#### Patsy Schwaiger, Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor

Patsy Schwaiger is a 1973 Mount Alum. She returned to the Mount in 1994, first as an academic advisor and then as a counseling intern in the Wellness Center. She received her M.Ed. from Xavier University in 1995 and earned independent licensure as a Professional Clinical Counselor with Supervisor status in the State of Ohio in 1999. Patsy has served the Mount community as a mental health provider since 1995. In addition, she was the Director of the Wellness Center from 2007 to 2023. Patsy is certified as a QPR Suicide Prevention Gatekeeper trainer and trains faculty and staff as Allies for the LGBTQIA+ student population. She is co-chairing the planning committee for the MSJ 1973 50th Class Reunion.

As she continues as a mental health counselor on campus, she is eager to pursue more training in Mindfulness and Trauma-informed care and will continue to serve as a Counseling Supervisor to students from local Universities.

As an Associate for the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati, she has embraced the mission and charism of Elizabeth Seton in her daily work with colleagues and students. Patsy has participated in the Charity Learning Community since its beginning and has been able to participate in mission trips to New Orleans and Emmitsburg. #### Melanee Wagener, MSOL, Director of Athletics and Recreation

Melanee Wagener is the Director of Athletics and Recreation at Mount St. Joseph University. She stepped into the role as the Interim Director in July of 2020, in the middle of a global pandemic, and was later named Director by President Williams. Melanee has been a member of Mount St. Joseph's athletics department since 2006, when she was the head coach of the MSJ women's basketball program. In 2010, she assumed the Associate Director of Athletics role under Steve Radcliffe. Prior to coming to the Mount, Melanee spent 13 years coaching Division I basketball at American University and Jacksonville University. Her transition to a career in collegiate athletics was a natural one after spending four years as a member of the women's basketball team at the University of Virginia. # Elizabeth Corbo, Ed.D., Assistant Professor, Gradute Education 9 Years of Service

Dr. Beth Corbo earned her doctoral degree from the University of Cincinnati in 2011 and her Master's degree and accreditation as a Reading Specialist from Xavier University in 1990. Prior to joining the Education Department at Mount St. Joseph University in 2014, Beth was employed by Cincinnati Public Schools as a classroom teacher and Reading Specialist. In these roles, she worked with a number of schools within the district in a variety of ways from providing research-based reading interventions to delivering professional development to district teachers. Beth believes that nothing that has greater transformational capacity than learning to read and is proud that the Reading Science Department at Mt. St. Joseph University offers those, whose goal is to see every child transformed by the power of reading, a unique opportunity to learn the highly effective methods to do so.

# Gene Kritsky, Ph.D., Dean of the School of Behavioral and Natural Sciences, Professor of Biology 40 Years of Service

Professor Kritsky taught courses in Biology, Botany, Ecology, Zoology, Marine Biology, Evolution, Entomology, Dinosaur Biology, The Cultural Impact of Darwinism, Paleobiology, Natural History, and Freshman Seminar. Kritsky joined the Mount in 1983 after receiving his BA in Biology from Indiana University in 1974, his MS and PhD in Entomology from the University of Illinois in 1976 and 1977 respectively, and having taught at Tri-State University in Angola, Indiana and at Minya University in Egypt as a Fulbright Scholar (1981-1982).

Kritsky has published over 260 papers and 10 books during his career including *The Quest for the Perfect Hive* which was nominated for the Ohioana award for the best non-fiction book by an Ohio author for 2010.

Kritsky has held several positions at the Mount including Chair of Biology for 19 years, Chair of Health Sciences when he led the Mount's Physical Therapy program to their initial accreditation (1999), and Dean of the School of Behavioral and Natural Sciences (6 years). Kritsky and S. Annette Muckerheide reintroduced the Biology Major to the Mount in 1985, and with the help of Dr. Elizabeth Murray, who joined the biology faculty in 1989, Biology flourished and grew to have 130 majors. Kritsky's MSJ Awards include the Sister Adelle Clifford Award for Teaching Excellence (1985), twice receiving the MSJ Distinguished Scholar award (2007 and 2015), and the Alumni Faculty Appreciation award (1999). He has received the Distinguish Scholar Award from the Indiana Academy of Science (2017) abd named a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (1997). He was only the nineth person in the Entomological Society of America's history to receive all three of their Society awards including Memorial Founder's Award (2012), Honorary Membership (2017), and named a Fellow of the Entomological Society of America (2019). Recently, Kritsky received the Ohio Biological Survey's Osborn Award (2023) for his lifetime of documenting Ohio's biodiversity through publications.
